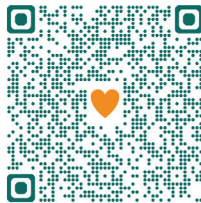

The Bracero Program, an agreement between the United States and Mexico, was signed in 1942 to address the agricultural labor shortage of the U.S. during World War II and Mexico's employment needs.

More than 15,000 Braceros came to Oregon over the years, many calling the Pacific Northwest their home to this day. Today, Mexican farmworkers are the backbone of Oregon's agricultural industry.

Oregon House Bill 2955, designates August 4 as Bracero Program Day, and our Annual Celebration is August 7, 2026.
